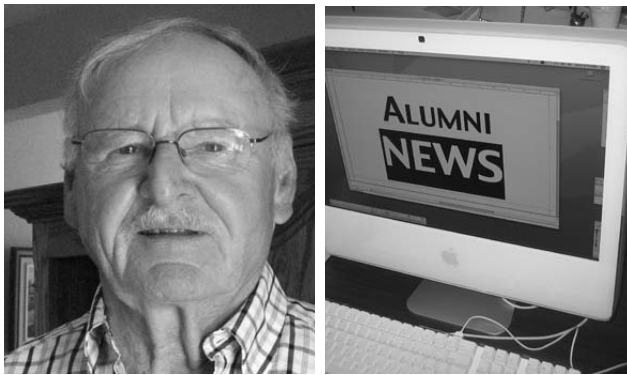

Current ORFA Technical Director and former ORFA President Terry Piche and Kathy were



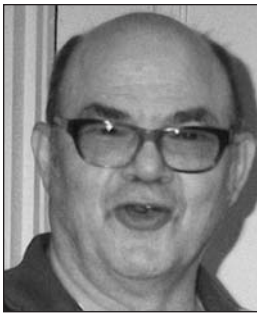

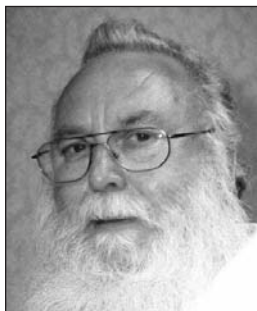


They raised siblings Cindy, Laurie and Ken... very proud grandparents to seven grandchildren... scattered from Halifax, Stoney Creek and Toronto.

Warkworth Winter Classics honour Peters

The official opening ceremonies at the Percy Bulldogs third annual Outdoor Winter Classic this past weekend had a very special component to the evening with a tribute to the late Doug Peters, who was arena manager for 24 years. His sudden passing last November touched the hearts of everyone who ever knew him as he was *"a familiar presence in the community."*

Master of Ceremonies Terry English talked about how Doug and his wife Jean, *"brought to Warkworth a passion for sports especially hockey."* He was responsible for introducing the sport of girl's ringette to Warkworth and along with coach Ralph Switzer, helped to start up the Warkworth Ringette Association, which quickly established itself as one of the more successful programs in the league.

"I was blown away by the tribute," Jean told EMC. Her husband was in his 25th year as arena manager in Warkworth when he retired. *"For 23 of those years the arena was in the black,"* she said. *"After amalgamation there were changes and so in 2001 he decided to retire to have more leisure time*



and to spend time with his children and grandchildren," she added. He had been involved in recreation for over 36 years, having started in Lindsay in 1965 *"as a rink rat,"* she said.....He worked his way up over the years to become certified as a Registered Recreational Administrative Facilitator.

During the Friday night tribute English talked about how he knew Doug.....*"I can remember as a teenager renting the ice with some friends for a game of shinny and on occasion Doug would strap on his skates and join us. He was a good skater, a strong skater and despite a noticeable age difference, Doug had no difficulty in keeping up with us young whippersnappers ... and he took great delight in reminding us of that fact."*

Coming out of retirement he agreed to help flood the ice for the two previous Outdoor Winter Classics and last year coached Team Peters in the first-ever Warkworth Ringette alumni game...*"It was a great reunion, it was wonderful to see all the girls out on skates again, and it was an enjoyable time for everyone involved,"* said English. It was also noted during the tribute that at visitation and the funeral, in lieu of flowers, the Peters family requested that donations be made to three specific charities, one of them being the Warkworth Arena renovation fund. *"We received over \$1,000 in donations in memory of Doug,"* said English. Thanking the Peters family for this gesture, English said it pushed the total raised to date to just under \$7,000..

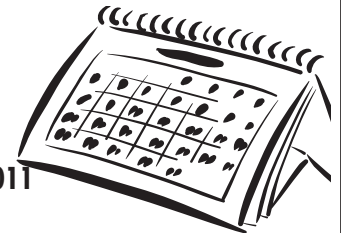
