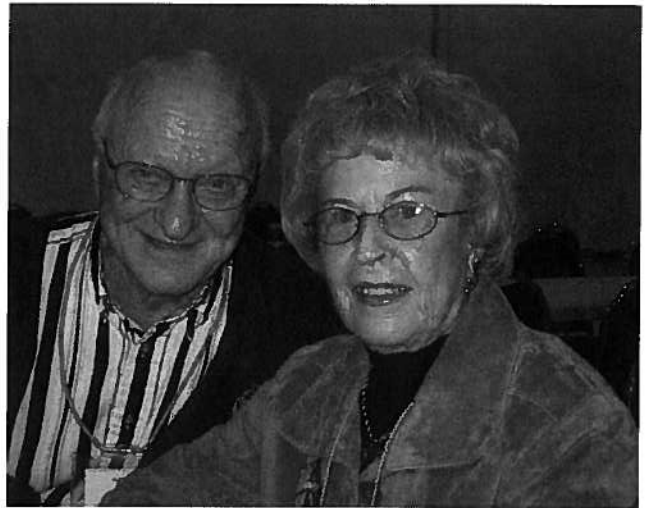

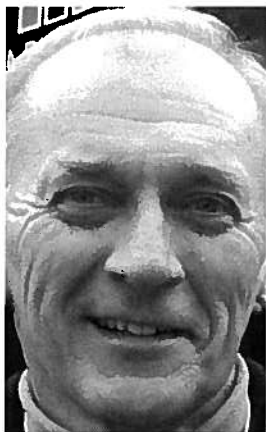

The one thing this hospital experience has shown me, is how reliant hospitals are on their volunteers to survive. I would encourage every retired ORFA member to volunteer at their local hospital. Thunder Bay's former Manager of Parks & Recreation, still finds time to volunteer. The



eighty five year old is a member of a steering committee, that is finalizing arrangements for a big day, at Chippewa Park. June 28th 2009, they will be serving, “free coffee & donuts, to 1000 people.. topping it off, with a \$800.00 door prize”.

Chippewa came under the Beavis administration, prior to his retirement in 1987. According to Bill, Chippewa fell on hard times, neglected and

simply not utilized to its fullest. At the turn of century, **Friends of Chippewa**, was struck to restore, preserve, and promote the park. They raised and invested \$5.8 million towards the redevelopment of the major facility. Restoring Chippewa Park that has been a favorite with city residents and visitors since it opened in 1921, in the former municipality of Fort William.

While all this is happening, Bill and his three daughters are feverishly working away to stage a family reunion at Hawk Eye Lake in 2009. They are targeting his wife's family. Optimistic that well over 100 family members will make the trip to Thunder Bay. Margaret Beavis passed in 2005.

Athletic Joanne captured numerous awards in track & field.. a 1961 Stratford Teacher's College graduate, she landed her first teaching job in Scarborough...left with three children to raise, following the loss of her first husband in 1970, (a harness driver and trainer), she settled in Hanover... met Don in 1971, at the Canadian Trotting Association's Annual Awards Banquet in Toronto.... they were married a year later....eventually settling in Hornbyboth served one term as President, Halton Agricultural Society in the early '80's, and ...the Canadian Roadster

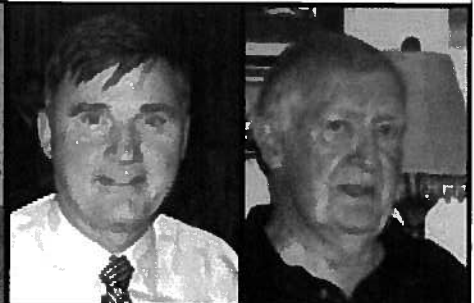

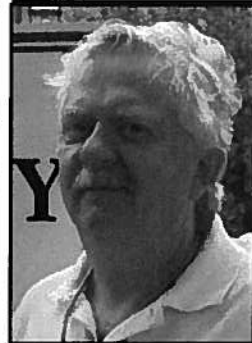

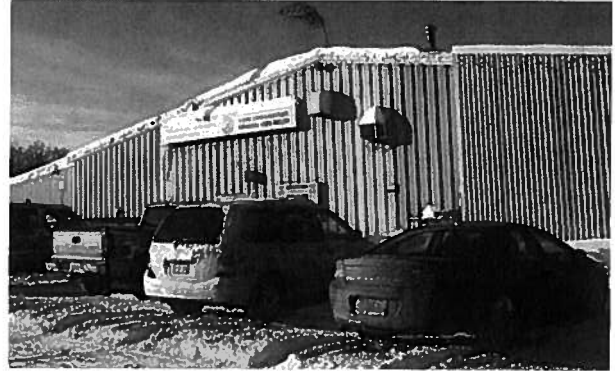

PORCYNALLY RETIRES

Ralph Porcynally was born in Northern Ontario community of Holtyre. His parents moved to several other northern centres before settling in South Porcupine. The South End Arena erected in 1926, simply became Ralph's second home. He played minor hockey and was one of Arena Manager Don Pecore's treasured "rink rats". One could simply add Ralph's name to mentor Pecore's long list of individuals, who ended up in the arena field.

Porcynally was twenty three years old, when he accepted a job offer, from the Township of Black River - Matheson. His arena career began June 1978, as Arena Foreman, at the Vern Miller Memorial Centre. He remained in that position for the



ensuing 15 years. Ralph vividly recalls the annual journey to Guelph, attending programs offered by ORFA, that prepared him to execute his arena duties, in a professional manner.

Elevated to Director of Recreation in 1991. His final day with the Township, April 1st 2008,... ending 32 years in the municipal field. For the record, the fifty eight year old, actually retired on August 31st 2008.

Ralph enjoyed his municipal career. Noting that annual budget sessions, were frustrating at times, trying to convince council to allocate funds, for much needed arena upgrades...funds were eventually allocated.. it just took a bit longer to get the projects started.....

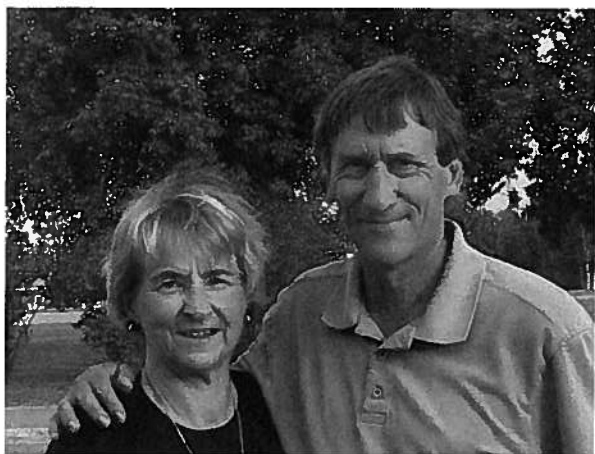
THE ROAD TO RETIREMENT

Cochrane, Ontario native Rolly Cote, graduated with a diploma from Algonquin College's Recreation Facilities Management Program in 1976. He accepted an offer from the Township of Black River - Matheson, that same year, to fill the vacant Director of Recreation position.

Four years later Rolly was on his way to Rayside-Balfour, Ontario. He was awarded a Recreation Coordinator's position, in that community, in 1980.

An opening in Iroquois Falls got his attention

and prompted him to return north in 1981, to accept the position of Director of Recreation Services for the Town of Iroquois Falls. A



career change surfaced in 2004. After a quarter of a century, overseeing Recreation in Iroquois Falls, he pursued an opening managing the municipality's Airport. The portfolio of Community Development Coordinator was added to his duties in 2005.

Fifty eight year old Cote came to the conclusion that his next move would be retirement. Considering that he had thirty one years of full time municipal service, coupled with two years of part time service, the time had finally arrived. He elected to retire July 16th 2007.....with one proviso....he continues to work "part time" retaining his airport duties, that will end June 2009...

He met Frances Anne (Boylan), the love of his life, while working in Black River Matheson .They exchanged wedding vows August 11th 1979 in Cochrane, Ontario. Fran carved out a teaching career, specializing in "French Immersion". Her first teaching assignment was in Rolly's home town, in 1977 followed by one year in Onaping Falls and 26 years in Iroquois Falls (1981-2007)... Fran retired March 1st 2007. They have two daughters, Kathleen and

Emma...

Both are very active volunteers. The environment plays a big role in Fran's life. She simply enjoys the outdoors, canoeing, cross country skiing, and camping. Rolly, the jock, continues to play hockey in both Iroquois Falls and Cochrane. His summer activities include fastball and golf.

Both Fran and Rolly continue to be active in the community on various volunteer organizations. They plan to do some travelling beginning in 2009 when Rolly is officially fully retired.
