IMPORTANT INFORMATION WITH RESPECT TO LINE MARKINGS FOR THE 2006-2007 HOCKEY SEASON

Please be advised that at a recent 2006 Hockey Canada Annual General Meeting in St. Johns, Newfoundland the Hockey Canada Board of Directors have ratified changes to the positioning of the goal line and the blue lines effective for the 2006-2007 season.

Changes will include moving the goal line from 13 feet to 11 feet from the end boards to the nearest edge of the goal line. Additionally, in rinks with a length of 185 feet or greater, the blue line will be positioned 64 feet as opposed to the previous 60 feet from the goal line. Measurement will be taken from the nearest edge of the goal line to the nearest edge of the blue line. On rinks less than 185 feet the blue lines will be positioned so they divide the distance between the goal lines into three equal areas. Attached you will find the revised wording for rule 3 (a) and 3 (b) as well as a detailed diagram to assist you as you make these adjustments.

Prior to Hockey Canada's Annual General Meeting a notice of motion was received through the Canadian Recreation Facilities Council that allowed O.R.F.A. and other recreation facility associations across the Country the opportunity to provide feedback. Concerns were identified to Hockey Canada including rationale for the changes and associated cost or capacity to implement changes. During the consultation, it was further clarified that the changes will be a directive to the various Hockey Canada Branches, but ultimately, would require support of building owners. Hockey Canada is optimistic that these changes will be phased in voluntarily with anticipated support from building owners and managers.

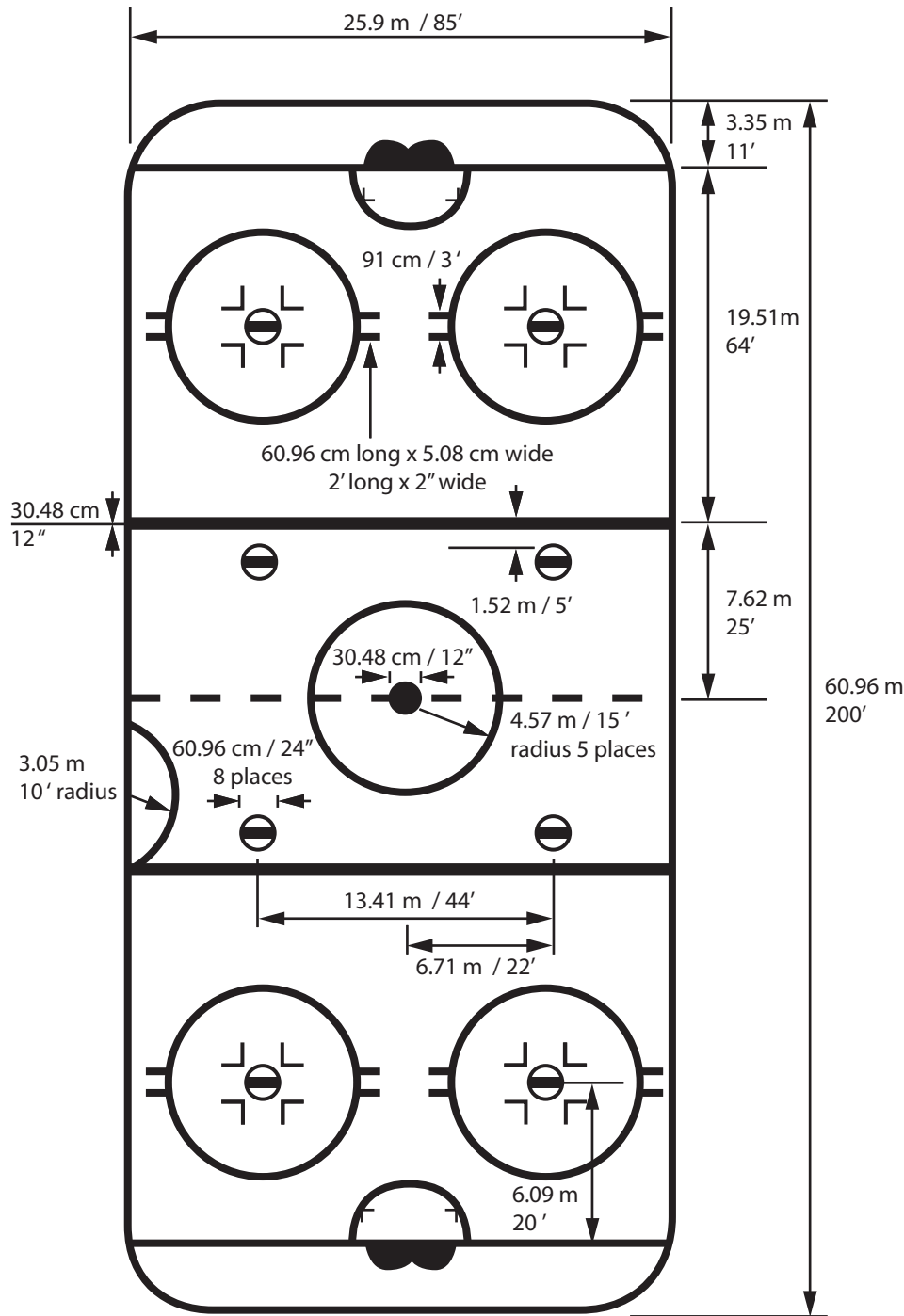

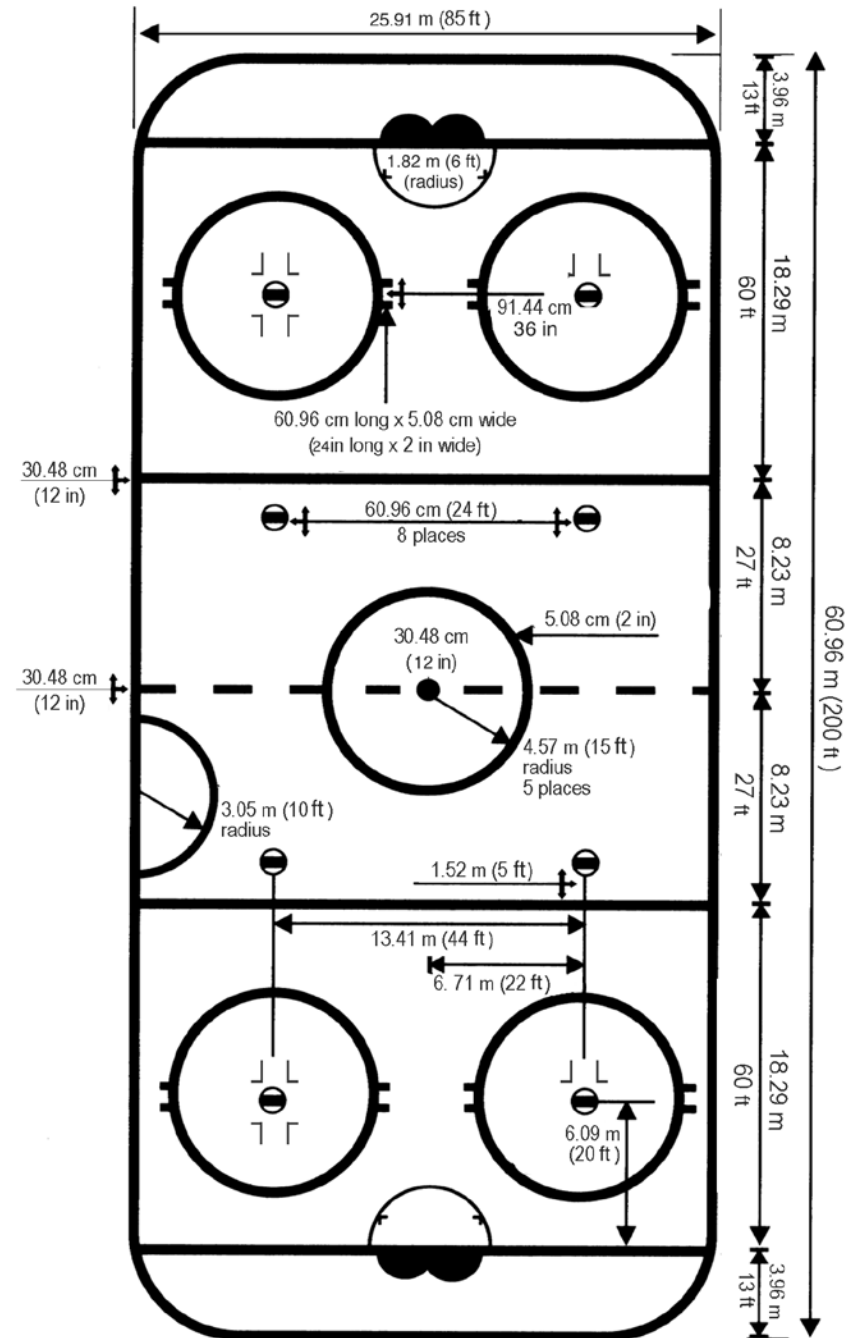
